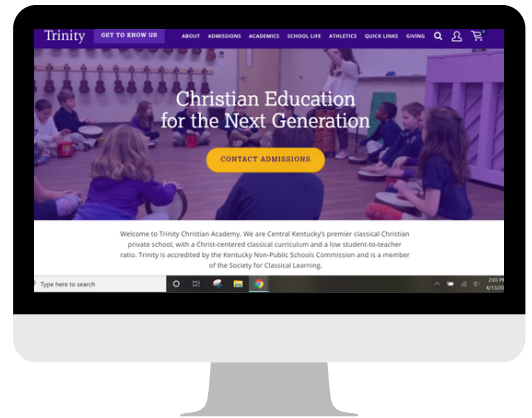

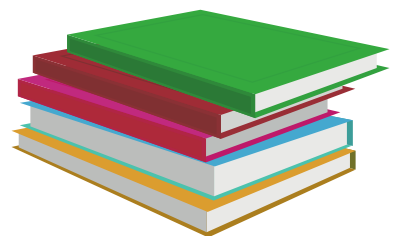

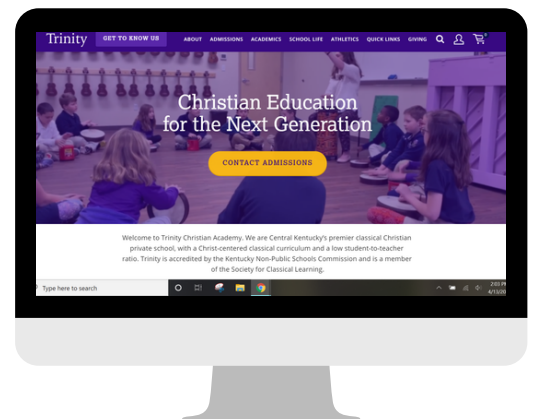

Girl Dress Code

Three-year-old pre-kindergarten students aren't required to wear uniforms but may do so if you desire. Three-year-old pre-kindergarten, 4-year-old pre-kindergarten, and junior kindergarten students may wear bottoms with an elastic waist band.



Top

- White, purple, or navy polo shirts. Peter Pan white collared shirts may also be worn.
- At least one shirt button must be buttoned at all times.
- Long-sleeved or short-sleeved shirts may be worn.
- *Shirts must be tucked in at all times.*

Bottom

- Khaki pants, walking shorts, skorts, jumpers, or skirts.
- Skirts, shorts, skorts must be no more than three inches above kneecaps.
- Closed-toe shoes, closed-heeled flats or tennis shoes.
- *Belts must be worn with pants or shorts.*
- *Leggings under skorts, jumpers, or skirts must be navy, black, or white.*

Boy Dress Code

Three-year-old pre-kindergarten students aren't required to wear uniforms but may do so if you desire. Three-year-old pre-kindergarten, 4-year-old pre-kindergarten, and junior kindergarten students may wear bottoms with an elastic waist band.



Top

- White, purple, or navy polo shirts.
- Long-sleeved or short-sleeved shirts may be worn.
- *At least one shirt button must be buttoned at all times.*
- *Shirts must be tucked in at all times.*

Bottom

- Khaki pants or shorts.
- Shorts no more than three inches above kneecaps.
- Closed-toe shoes or tennis shoes.
- *Belts must always be worn with pants or shorts.*

Additional Gear

Solid-colored (no writing) sweatshirts (no hoods), “fleeces” (no hoods), sweaters (no hoods), or sweater vests (no hoods), Trinity logos are optional.

- Colors: white, purple, or navy.
- Items listed above must be worn over the approved shirts, with the collar showing.

Hoodies and various colored sweatshirts with Trinity logo or Trinity sports teams can be worn on Friday spirit days only.

Additional Outdoor ONLY Gear

Jackets, hoodies, mittens, scarves, hats are permitted as needed.

Chapel/Field Trips

All students must wear either a white or a purple polo shirt with the Trinity logo and khaki bottoms for chapel day and field trips unless otherwise designated by the child’s teacher.

After School Care

Sickness Procedures

Out of consideration for other students and teachers, students with signs of a contagious illness (i.e., strep throat, fever over 100 degrees, vomiting) should not be sent to school. A student should be without a fever of 100 degrees or over for 24 hours (without medication, e.g., Tylenol, Motrin, etc.) before coming back to school. A student should be kept home if vomiting or diarrhea occurs during the night or in the morning before school. Please notify the school office by emailing attendance@trinitylex.org by 8:45 am or by telephone if your child will not be at school. Please send a note upon return to school documenting the reason for absences.

If a child becomes sick at school, the receptionist will contact the parents.

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

Arrival

All children may be dropped off around the curb in front of the school from 7:30-7:55 am. Children must be in the classrooms by 8 am; **after 8 am they will be tardy.** We will have staff assisting the children as they exit the cars. We are asking the older children to please close the car door as they exit.

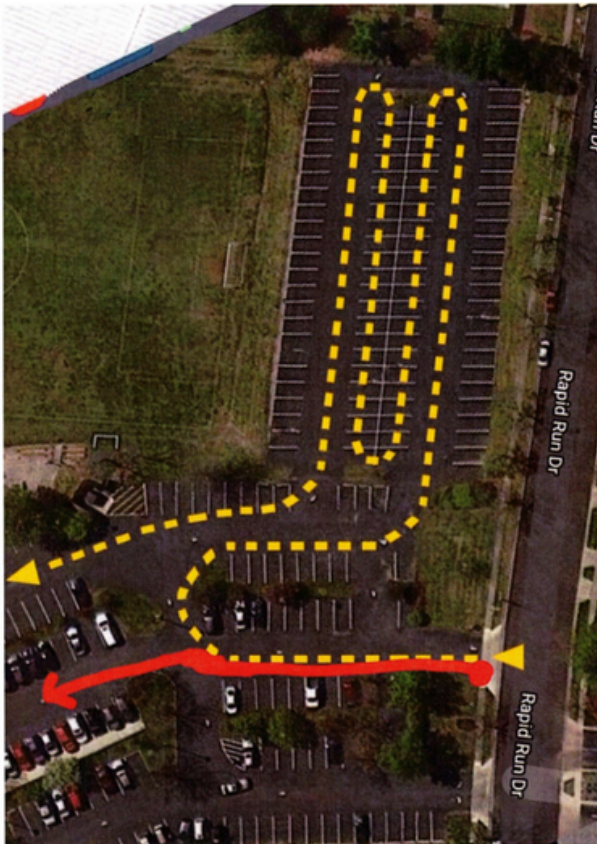
Children in grades 3-5 will enter through the gym doors. K-2nd grade will enter through the door by the Fellowship Hall (the doors just beyond the main doors as you continue around the front circle). Preschool students will enter at the main door and will be escorted by an adult to the Youth Room.

Dismissal

At 3:00 pm, we begin dismissing students. Please see the picture to the left for the traffic flow at dismissal. The yellow line directs parents of PreK and K children with older siblings and **all** children grades 1-5 to the back parking lot to "snake."

Parents of PreK and K students with **no older siblings** will follow the red arrow and wind around the front of the building to pick up their children under the awning and along the curb at **2:45 pm**. Three-year-old half-day PreK will dismiss at **11:30 am**.

You will receive a name hang tag for the rearview mirror of your vehicle for dismissal purposes. Please let us know if you need additional hang tags.





Food and Drink

Snacks

All children in grades PreK-5 will eat a mid-morning snack. Please be sure to pack a snack in your child's backpack daily.

Lunch

Depending on the day, children will be eating together in their classrooms, in the lunchroom, or outside. You may pack lunches in lunchboxes, or you may want to pack lunches in a paper bag so everything can go in the trash at the end of lunch. We do not have microwave use at the Lower Campus. Hot lunches may be ordered in advance for Wednesdays, Thursdays, and/or Fridays. You will receive an email when you are able to begin ordering the next set of lunches. - Grades 4-5: 12:00-12:25

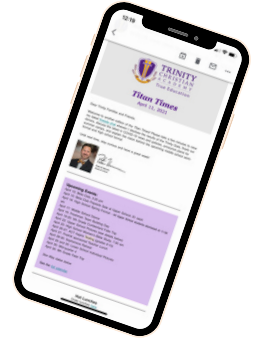
Water Bottles

The Titan Times is our school-wide weekly e-newsletter. It is emailed to all families on Monday and it provides information on things of interest for the entire Trinity community. *

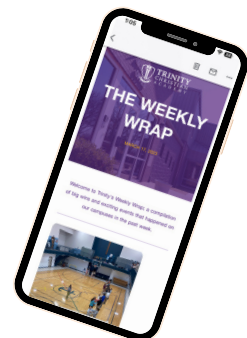


Bright Arrow Text Services

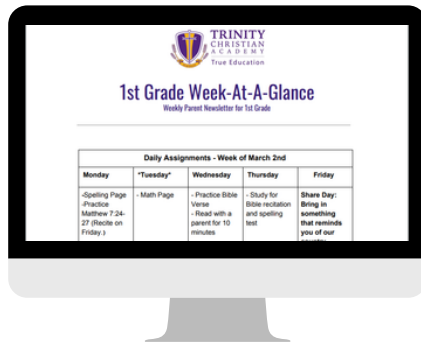
The Weekly Wrap
